In the name of god amen

The twentieth Daye of february in the first yeare of the Raigne of [our] Sovereigne Lord Charles by the grace of god of England Scotland ffrance [and] Ireland b[e]ing Defendour of the faith [etc] Anno qf Dom[ini] 1625
I Pascow Dunn of the p[ar]ishe of St Earth in the Countye of Cornwall yeoman being of good and p[er]fctt memorye god be prayesd Doe make and ordayne this my Last Will and Testament in manner and forme following that is to saye
Itt ffirst I commend my soule in to the Hands of god my Maker haveing A Remedy through the Meritts of Jesus Christ my Saviour to be made p[ar]taker of Life everlasting And I commend my bodye to the Earth whereof yt is Made
Itt I give and bequeath unto William my eldest Son two shillings [and] to every one of his Childryn one Shilling Itt I give to Alexander my Second Son two shillings and to every one of his Childryne one Shilling Itt I give to John Dunn my Third Son two shillings and to every one of his Childryne one Shilling Itt I give to John Hockyn and Alce his wife two shillings and to every one of their Childryne one Shilling Itt I give to William Nynnyes and Jane his wife two shillings [and] to every one of their Childryn one Shilling Itt I give to Sampson Heyme and Richow his wife two shillings [and] to every one of their Children one Shilling Itt Whereas I hold one Tennement Caled or kno[wn] by the name of Tremillyn by a Deede of Assignment made by Georg Payne of the p[ar]ishe of St Earth in the Countye aforesayd Deceased bearing date the Eight[enth] Daye of february in the Twelfth year of the Raigne of our Sovereigne Lord James late King of England [etc] of ffamous memorye deceased My Will is that Christian my wife shall have hould in njoye that foresayd Tennement wth thapurtunce to hir and hir Assigns Duering the terme and tyme Limited in tht the Deede as foresayd Itt Whereas I hould one other Tennement within the p[ar]ishe St Earth Caled or knowen by the name of Porthcollome by a Deed of Assignment made by Allexander Dunne of the p[ar]ishe and County aforesayd bearing date the xxvij th day of October in the first yeare of our Sovereigne Lord Charles now King of England [etc] My Will is that Christian my wife shall have hould and inioye that foresayd Tennement during the tyme limited in the Deed aforesayd yf Margerie the wife of John Ennys James their Sonn and Sephronya now the wife of the foresayd Allexander Donn soe long happenn to leive And as for all the rest of my goods and Chattells movable and unmoveable I give and bequeith to Christian my foresayd wife And my Will is that Shee shall paye my Debts and all such leagaseas as I have ~~givenn~~ formerly givenn and hereby I make hir my whole executor wittnes my hand and seale the Daye of [and] yeare first above writtenn
